



Anaphylaxis Awareness Training Confirmation Sheet

Anaphylaxis is a sudden and severe allergic reaction that can be fatal. An anaphylactic reaction requires immediate emergency medical treatment including a single dose of epinephrine by using an Epinephrine Auto-Injector such as EpiPen.

Saanich Schools requires that all staff who work with students are anaphylaxis aware and know how to use an Epinephrine Auto-Injector. Every year, you are required to review the EpiPen training video, review the District anaphylaxis policies and submit signature confirmation. You must either review the training online or attend a group training session held at each site at the beginning of the school year.
