	<p>MoonStick The Seasons of the Sioux Eve Bunting</p> <p>In this lyrical, haunting picture book, a young boy joins his father in an age-old Sioux tradition: the cutting of a moon-counting stick to keep track of the months of the year. And with each notch made in the stick, the boy learns more about the world around him. Luminous, carefully researched paintings by John Sandford combine with Bunting's poetic language to create a unique story of one Native American boy's journey toward adulthood.</p>
	<p>Spring Has Come! Terri Mack</p> <p>Spring is the season between winter and summer. The months of spring are March, April and May. What are some activities that you and your family do during the spring months?</p>
	<p>Cedar – The Tree of Life Brenda Boreham</p> <p>The Western Red Cedar tree is sometimes called The Tree of Life. This book explains some of the ways that the cedar is useful to the people of the Pacific Northwest Coast. What do you already know about the Western Red Cedar?</p>
